Registration Closes: June 30th, 2017

In many classes enrollment is limited, so please register as soon as possible. **Courses with fewer than 20 students enrolled may be cancelled.** If a course is cancelled, students may enroll in another class or receive a full refund. Please make note of course dates and times. Your receipt or cancelled check is confirmation of registration.

You will receive no other notification. Class rosters and room numbers will be posted the first day of school.

Transportation:

Attendance:

In order to receive credit, your student must not have more than one absence (four tardies count as one absence). More than 15 minutes late counts as one absence. **Any student with more than one absence will be withdrawn from summer school with no refund.**

For Online Learning students, attendance at the Student Learning Center is not mandatory, but provides excellent support for students as they engage in the course.

Grades:

In-district student grades are entered directly onto transcripts. Out-of-district student transcripts will be mailed to the school address on the registration form. All students receive grade sheets the final day of class. In-district student grades will not be mailed home.

For credit retrieval –

- \$225 – Incoming freshmen and sophomores
- \$50 – Incoming juniors and seniors

For new credit (Online only) –

Collection of Evidence (COE) Classes

COST: FREE

For incoming seniors only. Please see your counselor for more information.

COE courses offered:

- Exit Exam Math
- Exit Exam ELA
- Biology

The Collection of Evidence (COE) is an alternate way to meet the state testing requirement for students who have attempted the test but who have not met standard (Algebra EOC or Biology EOC; SBA for Reading or Writing). In this course, students will complete a set of work samples to submit to the state for scoring in January. The score on this collection will determine if the student meets standard in that area. Students not fully completing their set of tasks will have to continue the work back at their home school in the fall.

Students who successfully complete this course will receive 1/2 retrieval credit in the corresponding subject area (Pass/Fail).

Traditional Setting Course Offerings

The traditional-setting high school courses satisfy specific high school graduation requirements. Students successfully completing one-half credit courses will have received 57 hours of classroom instruction.

On a space-available basis, students may register for summer school for grade replacement with the approval of the secondary summer school principal.

ENGLISH

English (ENG 102/202/302/402)

Grades 9-12 (½ Credit)

These courses emphasize the fundamentals of writing, speaking and reading. (These courses satisfy graduation requirements for grades 9, 10, 11, and 12.)

MATH

Algebra 1 (MAT 202)

Grades 9-12 (½ Credit)

This course is for students who have mastered basic computational skills. The course offers an opportunity to learn how to perform computations of real numbers, solve equations and inequalities, graph equations and inequalities, solve systems of equation, and apply equations in solving story problems.

Algebra 2 (MAT 252)

Grades 9-12 (½ Credit)

Equipment needed: A graphing calculator (TI-83 Plus, or better). Second year Algebra builds on the concepts learned in Algebra 1 and Geometry and further develops the mathematical manipulations needed to solve more complex equations and simulation. Students will study linear, quadratic, logarithmic and trigonometric functions; inequalities, absolute value real and imaginary numbers.

Geometry (MAT 302)

Grades 9-12 (½ Credit)

This course emphasizes deductive reasoning as well as studying lines, angles, triangles and circles. These are studied with respect to congruence, similarity, etc.

SPECIAL EDUCATION

Special Education English

(ZEN 102/202/302/402)

Grades 9-12 (½ Credit)

A structured reading class for struggling readers on an Individual Education Plan (IEP). Courses with fewer than 13 students may be cancelled.

Special Education Math (ZMA 062)

Grades 9-12 (½ Credit)

For students who have math goals on their Individual Education Plans (IEPs). Courses with fewer than 13 students may be cancelled.

SOCIAL STUDIES

Washington State History (DSS 701)

Grade 9-12 (July 5-16)

This course is for students who have not met the Washington State History graduation requirement. This course engages students in learning about the geography, history, government, economics, and culture of Washington State.

9th Grade World History (SOC 101)

Grade 9 (½ Credit)

Includes regional studies in Latin America, the Middle East, and Southeast Asia, including culture and geography.

10th Grade World History (SOC 202)

Grade 10 (½ Credit)

Includes studies of international conflicts, challenges to democracy and human rights, and the emergence and development of new nations.

United States History (SOC 302)

Grade 11 (½ Credit)

Includes studies of the United States from the post-Civil War era to the present.

Senior Social Studies – Civics, Economics, & Contemporary World Problems (SOC 422)

Grade 12 (½ Credit)

Includes studies on government, economics and current global issues.

English Language Learners (ELL)

ELL summer school courses

will be counted for high school credit.

COST: \$25.00

These classes are for in-district students only and tuition cost is covered by scholarships.

ELL Beginning I (ELL 092)

This class is for current ELL middle or high school students with limited English language skills. **Enrollment is limited to 20 per class.**

ELL Intermediate (ELL 202)

An intensive reading and writing course. This class is for current ELL middle or high school students. **Enrollment is limited to 20 per class.**

ELL Advanced (ELL 302)

An intensive reading and writing course. This class is for current ELL middle or high school students. **Enrollment is limited to 20 per class.**

Online Summer School 2017

- **Want to earn your credit, but don't want to go to school every day?**
- **Want to work from 1:00 AM to 3:00 AM on a US History class or any time you please?**
- **Need to make up credit in a class this summer but have other plans for your summer that do not fit into a schedule?**
- **Want to take a new class for credit during the summer instead of the regular school year?**

Edmonds School District students (grades 9-12) have the option to take summer school classes online through the Edmonds eLearning Academy.

Really Big Summer School News:

Now you can take classes for new credit, not just credit retrieval (classes you have failed). Want to take a health class this summer due to lack of space in your regular year schedule? You can do that! Want to retake a math class before you start the school year? You can do that! And more...

Students may enroll in one class at a time (if they complete this course within 2 weeks, they can register for another) and complete the classes on their own schedule. These classes are mastery-based; you only need to complete those portions of the class you have not mastered, based on a pre-test. **Each course requires approximately 15 hours per week.**

Classes are available in Math, Science, History, English, Health, Personal Finance, PE, and electives. The complete list of course offerings are available on the registration form.

We have a student learning center for students to receive help from their teachers Monday-Friday on the campus of Edmonds Woodway High School. July 5th-27th 11:00 am -2:00 pm. Friday July 28th will be a half day and we will be available from 8-12pm to allow our teachers to complete their grades.

Classes for credit retrieval are \$225.00 per class for freshmen and sophomores, **\$50 for juniors and seniors.** New credit courses are \$225.00 for all students.

Classes start July 5th, 2017 and must be completed by July 28th 2017 (Finals must be taken in person)

The application process for the Edmonds eLearning Program is a three step process.
